1. [Rule 2.5(b) Situation 5(a)] A goaltender has been removed for an extra skater. The opposing team gets a breakaway. The goaltender comes back on the ice and throws his stick at the puck carrier in the neutral or attacking zone. SRD
2. [Rule 2.4 Situation 7] A coach informs the referee that he does not want to designate a captain or alternate captains because he wants to punish his players. SRD
3. [Rule 4.2(f), Situation 21(e)] A player has received two stick infraction penalties. There is an obvious third stick infraction committed by this player that calls for a double minor penalty and the referee has the penalty on delay. Subsequently, the non-offending team scores. SRD
4. [Rule 4.9(a) Situation 8 #3] The player taking the Penalty Shot shoots the puck and the puck hits the goal post, then hits the goaltender and goes into the goal. SRD
5. [Rule 10.2(c) Situation 19] During a face-off, a defending player makes physical contact with his opponent resulting in a Minor penalty being called before the play commences. The on ice strength becomes five on four. May both teams now make a line change?
6. [Rule 10.1(c) Situation 5] At 1:08 of the third period, the goaltender on her way to her bench to be substituted by another player, intentionally knocks the net off its moorings as she leaves the goal crease. The Referee has observed the action. SRD
7. [Rule 10.4(e) Situation 10 (3)] Team "A" shoots the puck at the goal of Team "B". The puck enters the net but immediately bounces out again without the Referee seeing the goal; however, it is observed by a Linesman. The Referee allows play to continue and Team "B" scores to cause the first stoppage of play. SRD
8. [Rule 4.12(c)] Team "A" was assessed the following penalties. When will each player return if the next stoppage of play occurs at 2:50? SRD

A - 12	2 minutes	@	12:00
A - 10	5 minutes + GM	@	11:30
A - 4	2 minutes	@	11:00
A - 8	5 minutes + GM	@	10:30

9. [Rule 6.7(a) Situation 8, 13, 14] A player from Team "A" is the instigator and the aggressor in a fight. Before reaching the penalty bench, he gets away from the linesman and becomes the instigator and aggressor in another fight. SRD
10. [Rule 10.2 (f) Situation 18] During a stoppage of play in an end-zone, two players from the offensive team are penalized and one player from the defensive team is assessed a 10 minute misconduct penalty. Where will the face-off take place?
11. [Rule 3.6 (c) Situation 4] A player loses his helmet and due to an apparent injury, is unable to properly replace the helmet or go to the players' bench. SRD

12. [Rule 7.3(f) Situation 8 Note 2] A player puts his stick in the crease while the goaltender is off the ice. SRD
13. [Rule 5.3(d) Situation 6] The Linesman observes a butt-end (calling for a double Minor penalty) by Team "A", No. 6. Before the play is stopped, Team "A" scores. SRD
14. [Rule 9.5, Situation 15] A penalized player returns to the ice through his own error, and before his penalty expires the other team scores a goal while he is still illegally on the ice. SRD
15. [Rule 8.1 Situation 1] Under what circumstances, when a cross-checking action is occurring would you also be able to assess a penalty for roughing?

16. [Rule 4.4(b) Situation 11]

A3 - 5 + GM + 2

B7 - 5 + GM + 2

A4 - 5 + GM + 2 + 2

B8 - 5 + GM + 5 + GM

What is the referee's decision?

17. [Rule 9.8 Situation 4] Can a player kick a stick that is on the ice back to his goaltender or another team-mate without being assessed a penalty? SRD
18. [Rule 6.3(a)(b)] State two situations where you may assess a major penalty and a game misconduct for charging a goaltender?
19. [Rule 3.6 Clarification 3(b)] The Referee clearly sees that a player has deliberately pulled his opponent's helmet off during a fight. However, there was no grabbing of the helmet to gain an advantage or inflict punishment. SRD
20. [Rule 3.1(c) Note Situation 5] The Referee signals a delayed Minor penalty and stops the play. The non-offending goaltender is still in her crease when the whistle goes and she proceeds to her bench after the whistle. SRD
21. [Rule 9.1(c) Situation 1] The puck is in the goal crease. A player who is outside the crease bats or scoops the puck out of the crease and into her body. She doesn't cover or grab the puck while the puck is still in the crease, just scoops it out and then grabs or falls on it. SRD
22. [Rule 7.3 Situation 1] A player of the attacking team enters the opponent's goal crease illegally with the puck in the attacking zone. The defending goaltender slashes her. The Referee signals a delayed penalty on the goaltender and subsequently the attacking team scores a goal while the delayed penalty is still on and the player is still in the crease. SRD
23. [Rule 10.5 Situation 14] After a shot by a team-mate, the puck is contacted by a high stick above the height of the shoulders, behind the centre red line, but it still continues on over the non-offending team's goal line and no player of the non-offending team touches the puck after its contact with a high stick. SRD

24. [Rule 6.5 Situation 1] The referee has signalled a delayed minor penalty for checking to the head on a player from Team "A". Team "B" scores before the play is stopped. Is the misconduct penalty still assessed to the offending player of Team "A"? SRD
25. [Rule 10.14(e)] A player or team official refuses to leave the bench or the ice surface after being assessed a Game Misconduct penalty, a Gross Misconduct penalty or a Match penalty. SRD
26. [Rule 10.11 Situation 1] An attacking player, from anywhere in the neutral zone, shoots the puck in the offensive zone and on the back of the offensive team's net. Where will the face-off take place?
27. [Rule 10.7 Situation 2] A stick is lying on the ice and an attacking player kicks the stick. The stick hits the puck and subsequently the puck goes directly into the goal. SRD
28. [Rule 1.9(e)] During a national tournament, such as the Royal Bank Cup, the host team insists upon keeping its players' bench for all games, as the bench and surrounding area have been painted with its team colours. One of the other teams recognizes there is an advantage to the home team for players coming off the penalty bench. They insist on being given the home team bench when it is their turn to be the home team. SRD
29. [Rule 10.17(f) Situation 1] The centre for Team "A" commits a face-off violation and is ejected from the face-off. Prior to the resumption of play, Team "A" calls for a time-out. Is this permitted?
30. [Rule 9.2(i) Situation 4] The Referee allows a controversial goal after consulting with both Linesmen and the appropriate goal judge. Before play resumes the goaltender bangs his stick against the glass in disgust with the goal judge. SRD
31. [Rule 4.9(d) Situation 5] A player who has been awarded a penalty shot is assessed a match penalty for a foul in connection with the same play or circumstances after the penalty shot has been awarded. SRD
32. [Rule 4.2(e) Situation 12]

- All three penalties have been assessed and Team A is to play 1 player short as a result of the extra Minor to A9. Just prior to the resumption of play, B24 is assessed a Minor penalty, bringing about the following situation.

- Do both teams play full strength? SRD
33. [Rule 4.4(a)] A player has been assessed a Major penalty and a Game Misconduct penalty for slashing with 1:00 minute remaining in the second period. The coach says that he will designate a player at the beginning of the third period to serve the Major penalty. SRD
34. [Rule 9.5(d)(e) Situation 4] The penalized team is two players shorthanded. One player #4 has 1:00 remaining in his Minor penalty and the other player #13 has 1:30 remaining in his Minor Penalty. Player #13 leaves the penalty bench early and checks an opposing player who is on a breakaway in the neutral zone. What penalties would be assessed? SRD

35. [Rule 6.7(a,c) Situation 8] A player from Team "A" is involved in a fight that causes a stoppage of play. Before reaching the penalty bench, he gets away from the linesman and starts another fight. What penalties are assessed? SRD
36. [Rule 10.15(e)] Play is in the defending zone of Team "A" as the buzzer sounds to end the third period. The players from Team "A" leave the players' bench to congratulate their teammates without being directed off by the Referee. As the players of Team "A" are skating to their goaltender, a player from Team "B" punches an opposing player and is assessed a roughing penalty. SRD
37. [Rule 10.12(b) Situation 1] A second puck appears on the ice and a player of Team "A" shoots the second puck at a Team "B" player who is on a breakaway in the neutral or attacking zone. SRD
38. [Rule 9.3] A player after being obstructed by an opposition player embellishes his actions as he falls to the ice. SRD
39. [Rule 10.2(g)] Under what circumstances are face-offs conducted at centre ice? SRD

40. [Rule 4.2(e) Situation 15]

A6 – 2	B14 – 2 + 2	5:00
A scores @ 4:30	B16 – 5 + GM	5:00

What is the referee's decision?

41. [Rule 3.2 Situation 4] What penalty will be assessed if A6, while in her defensive zone and with a stick in her hands, shoots a broken stick on the ice at an opposing player and hits the opponent or interferes with her progress, whether or not she has the puck?
42. [Rule 4.1(b) Situation 2] Penalties are assessed to players for infractions that have occurred during the pre-game warm-up.
43. [Rule 10.1(a) Situation 2] With 1:30 left to play in the first overtime period, a play occurs at the net, and an offensive player intentionally knocks the goal of its moorings. SRD
44. [Rule 4.11(b)] A goaltender has been assessed a Major penalty and a Game Misconduct penalty. There is no alternate goaltender recorded on the official game report. SRD
45. [Rule 4.10(a)(1), (2), (3), (4) Situation 2 & 5] A puck carrier has possession and control of the puck on a breakaway and the defending team has taken its goaltender off the ice. The puck is shot towards the net. A coach of the defending team throws a stick at the puck.

- A) The puck is in the attacking zone. SRD  
B) The puck is in the neutral zone. SRD

46. [Rule 10.8 Situation 24] A delayed offside is signaled by the Linesman. Attacking players from

Team "A", No. 5 and No. 8, properly tag up, but Team "A", No.10 goes into his players' bench from inside the attacking zone. The puck is still in the attacking zone. SRD

47. [Rule 4.13 Situation 17] A player is injured by a high stick. This action is observed by the Linesman but not the Referee. However, the Linesman is unable to identify the offending player. SRD
48. [Rule 4.4 Situation 13] The Referee has assessed a Minor penalty for charging. Before the play resumes the Referee realizes the penalized player has injured her opponent. SRD
49. [Rule 2.4(a) Situations 1 & 5] During a game, the Referee becomes aware that a team does not have a designated captain, but rather has four alternate captains. SRD
50. [Rule 6.2(a)] A player body checks an opponent to be violently thrown into the boards. However, the opponent is not injured and immediately rejoins the play. SRD
